

RE: Notification of Intent to Increase Water Rates and Charges

In accordance with the requirements of W. VA. CODE § 16-13A-9, please be advised that Greater Harrison County Public Service District (the "District") intends to pursue an increase in its current rates and charges for water service. An increase in the rates and charges for water service is necessary in order for the District to pay the operation and maintenance expense associated with the District's waterworks system. The average monthly bill for the various classes of customers will change as follows:

RE: Notification of Intent to Pursue a Sewerage System Improvement Project and to Increase Sewer Rates and Charges

In accordance with the requirements of W. VA. CODE §§ 16-13A-9 and 24-2-11, please be advised that Greater Harrison County Public Service District (the "District") intends to pursue a sewerage system improvement project that is not in the ordinary course of business. The project consists of (i) installation of approximately 156 bio-shell units in the polishing cell of the existing 0.60 million gallon per day wastewater treatment plant, (ii) installation of three positive displacement blowers, a blower enclosure, air piping and an access road, and (iii) appurtenances related thereto (collectively, the "Project"). The Project is necessary to assist in the Nitrogen removal process.

In order to pay the costs associated with the Project, the District intends to pursue an increase in its current rates and charges for sewer service. The average monthly bill for the various classes of customers is proposed to change as follows:
